we're counting on another big turnout. Bring some of that stuff you've been meaning to get rid of, and you may find someone who wants to give it a new home! We'll break down and go over to the Short Track section house for a pot luck lunch, followed by clinics and fun on the railroad.

Joe D'Elia of Proto Power West/A-Line will present a clinic on "Standards for Excellent Operation." This clinic will cover correct dimensions for rolling stock and track, leading to reliable and smooth operation. Joe has been an active model railroader for over 50 years. He ran a successful hobby shop, Arrow Hobbies, in the L.A. area, was one of the founders of the "Railroad Prototype Modelers" and an original member of the "1/87th Vehicle Modelers" group. Joe has been living and working in Carlsbad for the past 15 years and runs his own company, Proto Power West/A Line, with over 500 model railroad products. Joe also is the owner of New Rail Models and their excellent "Blue Point" manual switch machine.

The second clinic will be presented by Duncan McRee, who will discuss the Tam Valley Frog Juicer, a DCC device for auto-reversing the polarity of frogs. Besides being the simplest way to power route frogs on turnouts, it also has other applications in crossings, crossovers, turntables, and loops. The clinic will discuss how the Frog Juicer works and how to use it. Duncan has been in the hobby since he was 17, and models the Southern Pacific and the Nevada County Narrow Gauge in HO/HOn3. He is the owner of Tam Valley Depot, a model railroad electronics firm, and has written articles in the railroad press describing how he developed his products. Currently, Duncan is building a layout representing the Sacramento division of the SP including the town of Colfax where the SP and NCRNGRR interchanged.

Swap meet, pot luck, layout tour, and two great clinics! What more could you ask for? Bring your friends, and I'll see you there!

Jerry Schamahorn is one of the newest members of the San Diego Division. His interest in trains has spanned an entire lifetime, since both of his grandfathers were railroad employees. One was a conductor with AT&SF, the other was a section gang foreman with Union Pacific. His father bought a Lionel set for him when he was only two years old. As a teenager, he dabbled around with some HO. He discovered N scale in 1967 and has been immersed in that scale 44 years since.

Jerry was very active in the Belmont Shore RR Club in San Pedro, CA, for 38 years. He was on the committee of 4 persons who started N-TRAK, and the committee of 3 who petitioned the NMRA to recognize N scale and establish NMRA standards. Jerry is currently a member of Short Track RR Club in Vista, CA.

Growing up in Kansas, and graduating from Kansas State University, he is a former US Army Infantry Officer (Air Borne Ranger), and a Vietnam Vet. During virtually all of his professional life, he has been involved in sales and marketing, including working for some Fortune 100 companies. He founded two corporations, one in the service industry, the other an export company. Recently moving from Huntington Beach, CA, after 38 years there, Jerry now lives in San Marcos, CA. He is retired and enjoying being a part of Short Track RR Club. His other interests are music, from classical to bluegrass, reading and college football.

Jerry models AT&SF, U.P., MoPac, KCS, CB&Q, & S.P. In his early N scale years he modeled his own private road (Midland Pacific & Southern) due to the lack of prototypical equipment being available in those years. Roughly 50% of his roster of steam and diesel is decorated for that private road.

Currently between layouts, his goal is to build a layout in a 12' x 30' expansion of his home, planned for that purpose. Scenery and scratch building of structures are major areas of interest and experience. Kitbashing of engines and rolling stock is also fun.

LAYOUT TOURS

March (12th) Layout Tour

Roy "Pat" Archer (This is a change from previously published information!)

Pat has one of the most incredible collections of Lionel Trains in the U.S. He houses this collection in a 6000 sq. ft. three story "room addition" to his home in Escondido. Track runs between floors through helices and shelves on walls connecting the four layouts. He has both diesel and steam locomotives, some dating back to the 1930's, with freight and passenger trains of every description. This collection is a must see. If Lionel made it, Pat has it on one of his four layouts.

April (8th) Layout Tour

Ron Cousineau

Ron's G scale garden railway is centered in his back yard on a 20'x40' raised bed with a western theme. The layout has approximately 400 feet of track with a staging yard under the raised foundation of the house. What is interesting about this layout is the innovative use of everyday materials to build scenery and structures. Ron has demonstrated that you don't need a fat wallet to build a very presentable and interesting layout. This layout is well worth seeing.

Dick Trotter - Coyote Pass & Northern (HO)

The Coyote Pass & Northern is housed in its own space that has expanded over time, and is the result of many years of work by Dick and his crew. A layout built for operation, with a number of highly detailed "destinations" that can keep train crews occupied for hours with interesting switching problems, the CP&N is one railroad you won't want to miss. Of special note is the complete repainting of the backdrops by Glenn Shimada. The combination of fine modeling, outstanding detail, and well-designed operation track plan, managed by Rail Ops, is a free-lanced railroad you'll enjoy visiting.

July 9th Layout Tour

Duncan McRee - Tam Valley Railroad (HO)

The Tam Valley RR is a proto-freelanced model railroad based on the Southern Pacific. It is a shelf-style layout running through three bedrooms as a point-to-point layout about 80 feet long. The Tam Valley RR starts as harbor scene in Sausalito, California, runs up the Sierra Mountains, along the Truckee River, through the Nevada desert, and terminates at Ogden, Utah. The layout features beautiful scenery including hand-painted backdrops, numerous streams and rivers, and a number of Bob Mitchell's "Perfect Pines." There are also a large number of craftsman structure kits on the layout. A new multilevel Donner Summit layout is under construction that features the interchange between the Southern Pacific and the HOn3 Nevada County Narrow Gauge Railroad.

September 10th Layout Tour

David Balsler - Onion Valley Railroad (On30)

The Onion Valley Railroad is a reincarnation of David's former HO scale railroad that appeared in Model Railroader. The railroad has been in transition since the article appeared, and is now ready to be displayed for our enjoyment. Featuring several engines constructed or super-detailed by Bob Schimmel, MMR, this railroad is all about operation. David's "Jazz and Pie" operating group includes some of the best modelers in the area. If this is anything like the HO scale version, you won't want to miss this gem!

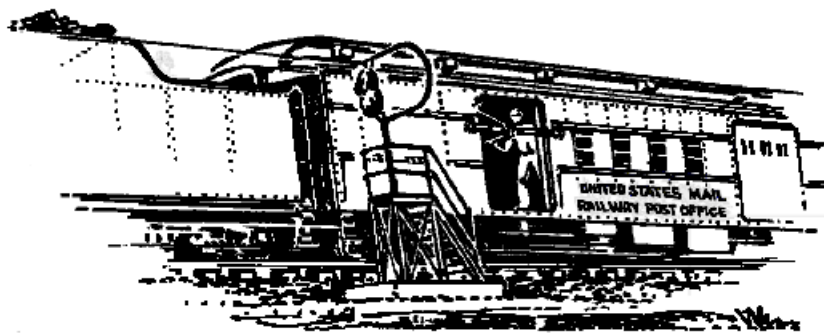
